Maryland Skilled Nursing Facility Staff to Receive Wound Care Training and Certification

Plainfield, IL — February 27, 2014, Wound Care Education Institute[®] (WCEI), a leading wound care and ostomy education provider, is partnering for a second time with The Health Facilities Association of Maryland (HFAM) and the National Alliance of Wound Care and Ostomy[®] (NAWCO) to offer wound care training and Wound Care Certification (WCC[®]) to eligible clinicians on Maryland's Eastern Shore. The training provides comprehensive coverage of wound care including such topics as the physiology of skin and underlying tissues; wound prevention, types, assessment and healing; nutritional impacts and adjunctive therapies. The one-week training will be held May 19 to May 23 at Harbourtowne Conference Center in St. Michaels, with the WCC certification exam offered on the last day.
