- Poor nutrition can have a substantial negative effect on the ability to build new tissue and defend against infection.





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Current wound care standards of care require a team approach. NWCC™ certified RDs/RDNs are key members who understand both the underlying causes of wounds and how to support the patient with proper nutritional interventions based on those underlying causes.

How to Pursue NWCC Board Certification

NWCC board certification is a voluntary choice made by eligible candidates to demonstrate their expertise in the management of nutrition and wounds.

The National Alliance of Wound Care and Ostomy® (NAWCO®) believes board certification should be available to all qualified candidates without requirements that involve months of long distance courses and preceptorships that can take you away from your job and family for extended periods of time. Our pathway options are straightforward (see NWCC eligibility chart).

Depending on your individual experience and education, NWCC board certification can be attained in as little as five (5) days. NWCC board certification is valid for five (5) years and does not demand expensive annual fees to maintain your status.
