Facts:

- It is estimated that in the U.S, 2.4 to 4.5 million people suffer from chronic lower extremity wounds.¹
- Chronic wounds last an average of 12-13 months, have a recurrence rate of 60-70%, and are costing in excess of \$25 billion annually to treat.²
- They lead to loss of function, decreased quality of life, and are a significant cause of morbidity.²

Chronic wounds are increasing in numbers and getting more difficult to treat. Wound care clinicians face these challenges everyday and the burden is growing.

When considering advanced wound care certification, choose the credential that aligns best with your experience and education.

The AWCC credential is designed for licensed clinicians who have successfully mastered the core principles of wound management and achieved prior certification in wound care (see the AWCC eligibility chart). The National Alliance of Wound Care and Ostomy®(NAWCO®) believes that advanced wound care certification should be available to physicians, nurses, therapists across the care continuum.

The AWCC credential is valid for five (5) years and does not demand expensive annual fees to maintain your status.

AWCC and Advanced Wound Care Certification board certification is a voluntary choice made by eligible candidates to recognize their expertise in skin and wound management.

 AWCC certification publicly affirms your advanced wound care skills, setting you apart from other clinicians certified in wound management.
